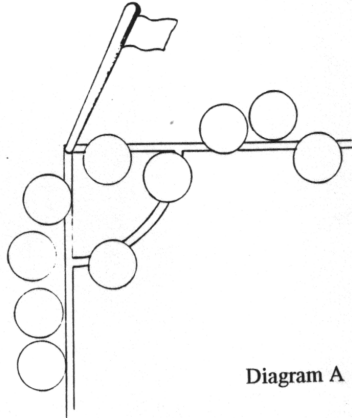


**QUESTIONS ON LAW 9 – THE BALL IN AND OUT OF PLAY and
LAW 10 – THE METHOD OF SCORING**

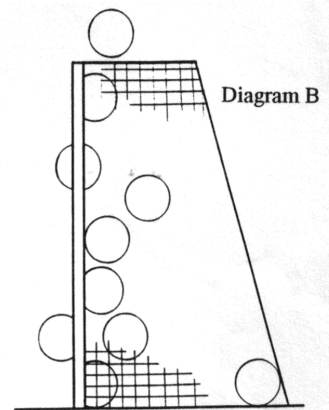
1. (a) Tick the balls in diagram A (below) that are out of play.
